Men's Corner

The next Men's Fellowship Breakfast will be Saturday, December 7th, at 7:30 AM. Bill Gookin will be sharing his testimony. Below is the testimony of Kip Smith, from the November breakfast.

Before I tell you how I got here. Let me tell you that I am embarrassed to say that my sins are many and my righteousness is small, but God has always been there, period.

I remember when I was five years old my mom getting me dressed on a Sunday in a suit and tie, and we all went to church. I was baptized at that age, but I did not know what it was then; surely not as vividly as I do today. Yet it must have been an important time in my life, amen.

Several times I have asked Jesus to come into my heart and forgive me over the years, but like many people, growing up I did not have time for God. I had so much responsibility and so much sinning to do. I went through life—getting married when I was 18 and my wife was 17. We have two daughters. I worked too much, spent too much, had too much stuff—yet I loved life.

One day, God woke me up. My dad and mom stayed in Florida in the winter. My dad had gone into the hospital and was in a coma. The doctor said that he would not come back from his coma as he had no brain activity. Everyone left the room but me. I got on my knees by dad's bed and prayed to God to please let me talk to my dad one more time. That afternoon my dad woke up and that evening we took him home. I spent seven days and nights with my dad and mom. It was the only time in my life my dad said that he loved me. I always knew he did, but he never said it before.

Now I have to tell you dad wasn't the only one who woke up that day. The power in that hospital room at that moment was amazing and indescribable. It had changed me forever. After seven days I had to go back to work. I never saw my dad again. After that when I came home, I started to really dig into the Bible and began to pray more. Trying to learn more, I came across a study thing on the internet called "Roadmap to the End." It was about planet alignment. I have always been fascinated with planets and stars.

Later, I talked with Tina, and we agreed we should check out churches. We went to First Baptist that Sunday. There were all these planets on stage—that was crazy. All the next week I listened to Christian music and the song "10,000 Reasons" really struck me. When we went back to FBC the next Sunday, that was the first song we sang. I thought, "OK, I got it Lord. I am yours."

Then one other crazy thing happened. I did all of my praying on the back porch, and I wrote some prayers in a spiral notebook. For some reason I did not start on the first page: I started part of the way back, and I did write a prayer on the last page. One day when we were away from the house, it rained, and the back porch windows were open letting in two inches of water. My notebook was submerged in it. After it dried in the sun, amazingly none of my prayers were wet—even the last page was water stained only up to the prayer. This notebook is a representation of all my sins—and the last page says "to be continued." I learned that Jesus died for our sins, and we have been forgiven. This makes me a different person for sure.

No, I am a long way from perfect and will never be worthy. But I am forgiven.

I still cringe when I think of my shallow judgement of her pool house. To this day, I do not own a pool, much less an indoor one! Yet, I found something that weekend that I still want more than anything. I want a heart like that girl's! A heart in tune with God's.
