They were on their feet, waving their arms, and yelling. I thought it was another day of Pentecost. One fellow came running forward and I thought, "What a service!" But he soon ran right past me. The pine branches on the Advent wreath were burning. It was quite a fire!

The next Men's Fellowship Breakfast will be held Saturday, January 4th, at 7:30 AM. Ken McKinley will be sharing his testimony. Below is the testimony of Bill Gookin, from the December breakfast.

Looking back, I can now say that I lived the first thirty plus years of my life without the benefit of much structure. I married my wife Alice in 1953 and came to know Jesus Christ as my Savior in 1972. I was a member of the former Avondale EUB church (later Avondale United Methodist Church) from 1973 until its closing in 2018, at which time God led me to begin attending here at FBC.

I believe the Bible to be the Word of God and Jesus Christ to be the only way to heaven, and that Jesus will one day return to Earth to receive His saints to Himself. I will be among His saints to spend eternity with our Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit (3 in One). I believe Jesus speaks to me through a still, small voice; through Scripture; through nature; through sermons; and through inner thoughts or meditations.

I was encountering difficult times once with my faith and prayer life, when God used the words in Revelation Chapter 2 to catch my attention. "You lost your first love," stood out on the page to the point I had difficulty closing the book. I soon began to consider how I had taken my eyes off of Jesus Christ, having placed them upon other things. I needed to get back to Jesus Only! In salvation, there is no one else (Acts 4:12)!

I was not called to be a preacher, a writer, a missionary to other lands, or even a healer. The still, small voice said no to all of these. Scripture says that through Jesus Christ we are all called to live as He did. Jesus says in essence, "As you have seen me do, go and do likewise" (Philippians 4:9). In other words, "Pray for the sick, help those in need, and love one another where we are now."

I have fished Lake Erie on a number of times, and on one of those occasions I was returning home by myself and decided to take a sightseeing trip. I had heard of "Blue Hole" in Castalia, Ohio, (Route 269), and went to look at it. While I gazed a bit, I was fascinated by the fact that it appeared to be so clear. I could see deep down into it. Then a still, small voice said, "There is no oxygen in the water. Look toward the spillway where the water flows out." As the water moved over the rocks, life began to appear. The still, small voice said, "Rocks agitate the water, enabling oxygen to occur, and therefore creating an environment for life." Then the voice said to me, "I want you to BE MY ROCK."

The truth was, I did not want to be a "Rock." My "ego" did not appreciate this. God, however, did not appreciate my ego! After much fussing, I accepted my role. Doing so has caused much stirring, many debates, misunderstandings, and hindered relationships in my life. God, however, has provided me with strength and love to cope with these outcomes.

God needs more "Rocks." And when you have done all you can, just stand (for Jesus). **Ephesians 6:13**
