Karen and I have some friends from our seminary days who recently moved to the Pittsburgh area. On February 2nd, they made the hour journey from their home to Punxsutawney to

watch the famous groundhog, Punxsutawney Phil, emerge from his burrow and fail to see his shadow. Great news! Only six more weeks of this winter. Then we have a new season.

But there is one season in our lives that should never be over. Or maybe I should say there is one thing that should never be out of season in our lives. That would be prayer.

I visited one of our church's home Life Groups recently. They were focused on prayer that evening. Here are some tips that came up that night that may help you more intensify your prayer life:

1) Bend over and put your face between your knees as Elijah did (1 Kings 18:42). I am not being facetious in the least. It is a position of reverence.

2) You may have seen videos of Orthodox Jews who pray regularly before the Wailing Wall in Old Jerusalem and who bob their heads up and down as they pray. When I asked my guide why they do this, he replied that it helps them concentrate and add intensity to their prayers.

3) Fast. Jesus and the early church did it. Enough said.

We will be having another church-wide emphasis on prayer in the weeks leading up to Easter. I hope many of you will be able to attend some of our prayer sessions. But you don't have to wait until then to start. There are three good ideas above you can try right now.



Members' Ministry

The other day I heard a story of a man who sued God and His Church. It seemed that when he opened a bar next door to a church, the Pastor and the people felt compelled to pray that God would shut it down as they gathered for a week and prayed. Two weeks later, lightning hit the bar and it burned to the ground, while nothing else around it was destroyed. The bar owner heard about the Pastor and church praying to close his bar and sued them.

In court the bar owner's case was explained that his place was prayed over for God to close it. The judge listened intently, and then he called for the Pastor to give his testimony. The Judge asked, "Did you really pray that his bar would be shut down?" The Pastor said, "Yes, well kind of. We didn't believe God would really do it!"

The Judge shook his head; then he said this, "I am perplexed. Here I have a bar owner who believes that prayer works and God answers prayer, and a Pastor and church who aren't sure if prayers work or if God answers prayers! How can this be?"

Many times we pray and go through the motions, but we pray doubting God will answer. Then we wonder why God won't answer our prayers the way we prayed. When we doubt God when we pray, He has already answered that prayer.

Over the years, God has answered our prayers in only ways He could, day after day He answers them, and we have learned to never come before Him doubting. My health keeps me at bay, and every day I come before His throne and pray to have the strength to get out of bed and accomplish His plans. Wherever He leads, I will follow, and I mean every day!

What about you? Do you doubt when you pray? If so, ask God, Who gives us wisdom and faith, to forgive your doubts, to give your faith strength instead of fear—and believe me, He will do it!

Are you ready to see God move in your life? Then pray without doubting! And watch Him move the mountains in His way!

God's Word says this:

"Jesus replied to them, "Have faith in God. Truly I tell you, if anyone says to this mountain, 'Be lifted up and thrown into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that what he says will happen, it will be done for him. Therefore I tell you, everything you pray and ask for — believe that you have received it and it will be yours. And whenever you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, forgive him, so that your Father in heaven will also forgive you your wrongdoing." Mark 11:22-25, CSB

Amazing, what has probably gone into providing forecasters the needed tools to accurately predict our weather and then they end up relying on one of God's small sleepy critters looking into flood lights and cameras to predict our fate. Hopefully, the little fella is right on target with his prediction and may be even allowed to have a few more weeks of much needed rest.

The heater located in the Gator was moved from the back seat to an area underneath the dash for easier access.

A new control unit for the pick-up truck salt spreader was installed; and, the salt spreader was power washed.

FBC snow equipment has been serviced, and the volunteers are prepared.

A leaking roof at KKDC was repaired, and a new dishwasher and a toilet were installed.

The sewer pipeline required for the Long & Wilcox development of the Brown Farm was discussed. First Baptist Church is willing to work with Long & Wilcox on an easement for the sewer line. The City of Grove City has requested that Long & Wilcox work with FBC to decide on an east access location to Orders Road.

The Trustees met with the Franklin County Engineers to discuss needed repairs on Orders Road.

Baptist Builders will be installing new LED lights in the parking lots. These lights have the potential of lasting thirty years. Since the parking lots are in good condition, they will be sealed, re-stripped, and patched on an as-needed basis.

The Nativity scene and Christmas lights along the FBC driveway were taken down and put into storage. The lobby and hallway decorations were also put away for the season.

Men's Corner

The next Men's Fellowship Breakfast will be March 2nd at 7:30 AM. Len Stayton will be sharing his testimony. Below is the testimony of Pastor Josh Wright from the February breakfast.

I once had a counselor tell me that statistics say that, due to the environment that I was being raised in, I would end up in jail or worse. That because I had seen abuse, I would be abusive. That I would be an addict because I was raised in a home with addicts. What that person didn't realize is that God does not care about statistics.

My mother gave birth to me when she was 17. My father did not want a child, so he was not in the picture. My mom found herself in a highly abusive relationship with a drug addicted alcoholic who was made to believe he was my father. Some of my earliest memories are of seeing my mom get hit and then being told to lie about what had actually happened.

After years of abuse my mom left but found herself falling into the same cycle of being with men who had issues with drugs and were not of the highest character. This led to one of my mom's boyfriends kicking us out without us having a place to live.

After a couple of nights "camping" in the car, my mother sent me to live with the man whom I assumed to be my father. He was not capable of raising a child. At the age of 6, I learned to take care of myself. I woke up, had breakfast, and caught the bus by myself. When I got off the bus, I would be the only one home. Many nights I would go to bed without an adult in the home. It was during one of the few nights he was home that he informed me, while in a drunken rage after an argument on the phone with my mom, that he wasn't my dad.

When I finished the first grade, I moved back with my mom and the man she would eventually marry. For the first time in my life things were fairly stable. He did drugs as well, but he never hit my mom. We didn't have much money, but it was better than in years past. This would be the norm for most of my life.

When I was around 14 or 15, my mom became addicted to pills after having an operation. This led to an addiction to stronger drugs that eventually took her life when I was 23. I didn't know how bad it was at the time but quickly learned. She started stealing to get money for more drugs. I started to pull away from my family because I couldn't stand seeing her like that.

It was around this time that I joined the wrestling team and became friends with a guy named Matt. Matt was the first person I recalled saying that he was a Christian and his life reflected it. We became quick friends and started hanging out often. When he got his license, my house was the first stop. A couple of days later Matt invited me to church, and a few weeks later I accepted Christ as my Savior. Later that year I would move in with Matt and his family.

God used Matt and his family to impact my life greatly. His mother introduced me to Children's Ministry and then gave me my first job in ministry. God knew what people said my life was supposed to become, but God had bigger plans. Every day I thank God for bigger plans!

I made a stop on the way home that night and bought a box of tiny creamers with different flavors. My new Barista was thrilled that he could give "those in need" some choices. It was just a start, but God certainly used Mike, the gas station attendant, to open my eyes.
