"The Cross Of Christ"

Mark 15:22-26

Christianity has a very famous visual <u>symbol</u>. However, the <u>cross</u> was not its earliest symbol. Because of the wild accusations which were levelled, they "had to be very circumspect and to avoid flaunting their religion. Thus, the <u>cross</u>, now the universal <u>symbol</u> of Christianity, was at first avoided, not only for its direct association with Christ, but for its shameful association with the <u>execution</u> of a common criminal also."

So on the walls and ceilings of the catacombs (underground burial-places outside Rome, where the persecuted Christians probably hid), the earliest Christian motifs seem to have been either con-committal paintings of a <u>peacock</u> (supposed to symbolize immortality), a <u>dove</u>, the athlete's victory <u>palm</u> or, in particular, a <u>fish</u>. Only the initiated would know, and nobody else could guess, that <u>ichthys</u> (fish) was an acronym for *Iesus Christos Theou Huios Soter* (Jesus Christ, Son of God, Saviour). But it did not remain the Christian sign.

Instead the chosen symbol came to be a simple <u>cross</u>.

I) Provided The Payment For Our Sins: Romans 5:8

III) Provided A Personal Way To God:

- A) The curtain in the temple was torn. This signified that we now have <u>direct access</u>.
- B) Now with the death of Jesus, the curtain which <u>hid</u> God was torn and men could see <u>Him face to face</u>.
