It is the most important study, and when mastered, will richly answer all your pains. I bid you, my friend, remember that One at whose bar we shall both presently appear hath solemnly declared that without it we shall in no wise see His kingdom." A very <u>wise</u> recommendation to a man who is noted in the history of the world as being a <u>wise man</u>. History, however, affords us no <u>evidence</u> that Franklin <u>heeded</u> those words.
