JAMES #1 The Forgotten Key to Victorious Faith James 1:1

I. THE AUTHOR: 1:1a

- James was the younger half-<u>brother</u> of Jesus, but the oldest son of Joseph and Mary. Mark 6:3
- 2. James thought Jesus was <u>crazy</u>. Mark 3:21
- 3. James was not a follower of Jesus until <u>after</u> the resurrection of Jesus. John 7:3-5; 1 Corinthians 15:7 Acts 1:14; Galatians 1:19
- 4. James became the top <u>leader</u> of the church at Jerusalem. (Acts 12:17; 15:11-21; Galatians 2:9).
- 5. James is known in history as the apostle with the "<u>camel knees</u>" because of his high-level commitment to prayer.

II. THE AUDIENCE: 1:2a

- 1. Jews: 12 Tribes of Israel
- 2. Former members of the <u>church</u> of Jerusalem scattered around the Mediterranean because of Jewish and Roman persecution in Jerusalem. (Acts 7,12)
- 3. Ordinary people with problems.

III. THE APPELLATION

Romans 1:1; Philippians 1:1; 2 Peter 1:1; Jude 1:1

Being the bondservant of Jesus is the key to victorious faith.

- 1. A bondservant is owned by their Master. 1 Corinthians 6:20
- 2. The bondservant <u>serves</u> without expecting anything in return. Luke 17:7-10
- 3. A bondservant is totally <u>surrendered</u> to the Master. Romans 12:1; Luke 9:23
- 4. A bondservant is more than a volunteer.
- 5. A bondservant finds <u>freedom</u> and joy in serving their Master.
- 6. A bondservant is not a slave by circumstance, birth, or force, but by choice.
- 7. <u>Jesus</u> is the ultimate example of a bondservant and calls us to follow His example. Mark 10:43-45; Philippians 2:5-7
